#### Notes:

- Label/mark EVERYTHING with Troop 890 and the Scout's name.
- No snacks or food in tents. Ants can be a real problem.
- ALL shoes must be close-toed (closed-toe sandals ok).
- Everything except cot goes into foot locker, including sleeping bag (use compression bag if needed).
- \*Tent floor cover: the purpose for this is to make the wood floor more comfortable and to cover the gaps between boards, so small items don't fall through.
  - 1. You only need one piece of carpet per tent.
  - 2. The carpet should be of the indoor/outdoor variety (Astroturf) or a canvas painter's drop cloth and about 7'x7'.
  - 3. Your name and "Troop 890" must be clearly labeled on the back of the carpet (min 2" lettering).
  - 4. You are solely responsible for transporting the carpet to and from the camp no exceptions. Do NOT leave your carpet at camp.

# **Camp Constantin Air Conditioner**

Camping in July is hot. This can help.



### **Materials**

- 3/4" PVC pipe 8 feet
- 2 unthreaded 3/4" PVC 90° elbows
- 4 unthreaded 3/4" PVC tees
- 4 unthreaded 3/4" PVC caps (optional)
- 2 zip ties
- 1 fan (<u>Amazon</u> / <u>Academy</u> options); any battery powered fan less than 12" in width should work

### **Instructions**

Cut the pipe into

- 6 twelve inch sections
- 4 six inch sections

The 6" sections are for the four feet as above; assemble according to the picture.

Don't glue it. That way it can be disassembled and carried out more easily.

Total cost may be as high as about \$35, depending on the fan. PVC cost is around \$10.
